

STUDY NOTES:

"The problem with the church today is that we start at 11 o'clock SHARP and we end at 12 o'clock DULL" – Vance Havner

Three things that brought about famine in Israel, that we have in our country today:

1. Idolatry
2. Sexual immorality
3. Murder

- I. The Prayer that David Prayed – vs.1
 - a. We can reap the seeds of sin that other people plant. We can reap the seeds of unconfessed sins that other people want deal with.
- II. The Plan that David was Given – vs.2
 - a. Deal with the Gibeonite problem
 - i. Admission of sin is required
 1. In revival, we are willing to do what God wants, even when it hurts us!
- III. The Plea that David Inquired – vs. 3
 - a. David made restitution

Reflections Questions:

1. Why has "the church" lost their hunger, their appetite that we should have for the Word of God?
2. How can we learn from the past? Why should we desire to learn from the past?
3. Saul looked to men for answers. David sought the Lord. What can we take from the life of these two men that should teach us a primary fundamental truth? (see Psalm 118:8)
4. Sometimes we must deal with the problems that others create. In knowing this, how does this make you feel?
5. When we break a covenant that we make, should the outcome surprise us? Why? Are covenants really that important?
6. What if the problem behind the problem.....that is keeping you from having personal revival?
